Szekler memorial park inaugurated in Bonyhád

Speaking at the inauguration of the Szekler memorial park in Bonyhád, State Secretary for Hungarian Communities Abroad Árpád János Potápi emphasized that the open Szekler gates of the park symbolize the open minded attitude, the respect and acceptance towards everyone. The National Association of Bukovinian Szeklers built a Szekler gate in the town in Völgység in 1995, and built a park next to it, which commemorates the ethnic group that found their home in Hungary in 1944.



Speaking in Arad on 6 October, the Hungarian national day of mourning, State Secretary for Hungarian Communities Abroad Árpád János Potápi pointed out that today, being a Hungarian citizen in the Carpathian Basin is much more an advantage than a drawback, and if the Hungarian people don't give up hope, if they can fight together, there's no force that can break the nation. Remembering the martyrs of Arad, the state secretary stressed that "Arad is the symbol of Hungarians' unbreakable will to live." A limited number of participants could attend this year's national day of mourning due to the epidemic, and they had to keep a distance and wear a mask while listening to the speech and placing their wreaths and candles.

Hungarian political presence in numbers: local elections' results published

Nearly two weeks after the local elections in Romania on 27 September, the Central Electoral Bureau (BEC) published the official results on its website. Regional and parliamentary candidates of the Democratic Alliance of Hungarians in Romania (RMDSZ) received 381,445 votes in total, which is 4.86 per cent of all the valid, i. e. nearly 7,852,000 votes. RMDSZ received approximately 92 per cent of the votes for regional candidates of Hungarian parties. That is 4 per cent better than in 2016. The remaining 8 per cent is divided between the Hungarian Civic Party (MPP) and the Hungarian People's Party of Transylvania (EMNP).

RMDSZ registers signatures necessary for the parliamentary elections

President Hunor Kelemen posted on his Facebook page that RMDSZ registered 153,000 supporting signatures collected in less than a week for the Central Electoral Bureau (BEC). He added that they set a time record with the collection of the signatures, as Hungarians expressed their support and the need for Hungarian representation in the parliament.

According to Jenő Hajnal, we often hear that the number of Hungarians in Vojvodina is decreasing but there are still a lot who hold on and believe in the permanence and prosperity of Hungarians.
